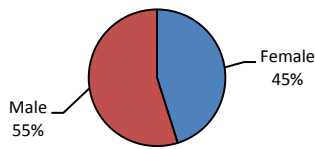

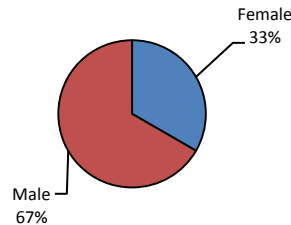

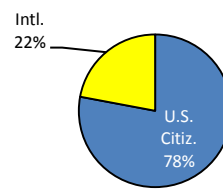
**Geography (PhD)¹
Gender**



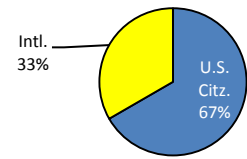
**Geography (MA)¹
