- **External funding:** In our current graduate student cohort (2012-13), over one third of students have been awarded prestigious external fellowships and/or grants, including the National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship, the National Science Foundation Dissertation Improvement Grant, the Jacob K. Javits Fellowship, the Ford Foundation Predoctoral Fellowship, and the Mellon/ACLS Dissertation Fellowship, among others.
- **Graduate student satisfaction:** In the most recent survey of graduate student satisfaction, compared to students in other UCSB graduate programs more Linguistics graduate students reported a high degree of satisfaction with their program's instruction, advising, and academic climate.

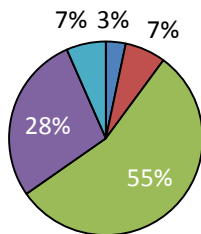

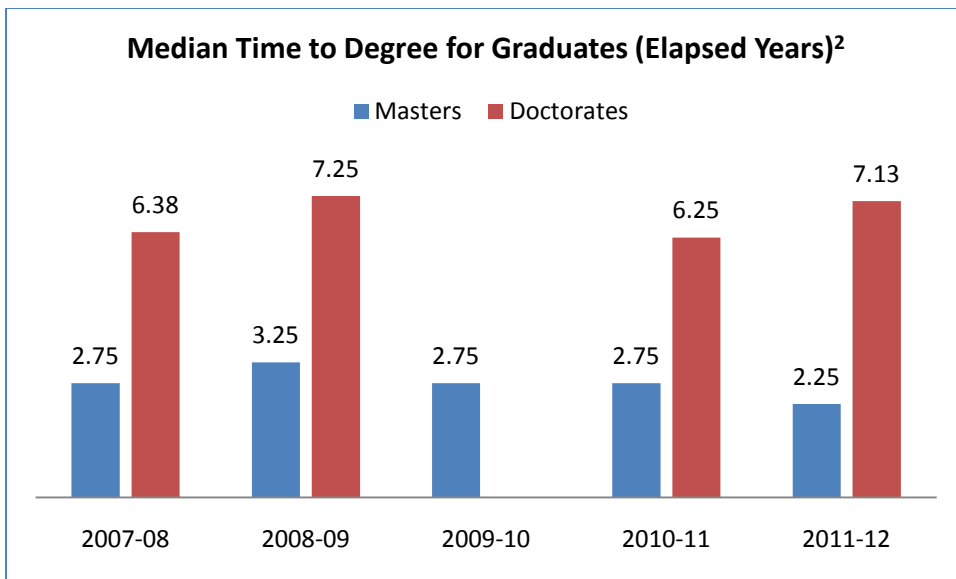
